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# INTRODUCTION

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The UvA Green Office is a student-run and student-led organisation based on the Green Office Model created by RootAbility. The mission of the UvA Green Office is to help turn the University of Amsterdam into a sustainable university and in doing so inspiring students and staff members to implement sustainability in their daily lives and environment. The UvA Green Office has been working on this mission using a threefold approach:

- **Consulting** staff members and students on how to implement sustainability at the university and in their daily lives.
- Introducing, supporting and implementing **innovative** sustainability concepts and ideas.
- Creating sustainable communities by **connecting** students and staff members from all departments with each other and sustainability organisations



# INTRODUCTION

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The projects of the UvA Green Office involve all aspects of the university.

Firstly, the Green Office implements sustainability in the facilities of the university. This includes waste management, the catering and energy.

Secondly, the UvA Green Office engages with the different communities at the university and works with them to implement sustainability there. By doing so, the Green Office also creates and supports the sustainability community at the university.

The Green Office also works on bringing sustainability in education. This involves both the sustainability in the current curriculum, but also hosting lectures and symposia about sustainability to spread knowledge and awareness.

Finally, the UvA Green Office works on the sustainability of the research conducted at the university. It does do through supporting researchers working on sustainability issues and helping them to spread knowledge of what they have been working one.

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This document provides an overview of all activities of the UvA Green Office from September 2018 to January 2019 (roughly the first semester of the academic year).

# ORGANISATION AND STRUCTURE

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# ROLES

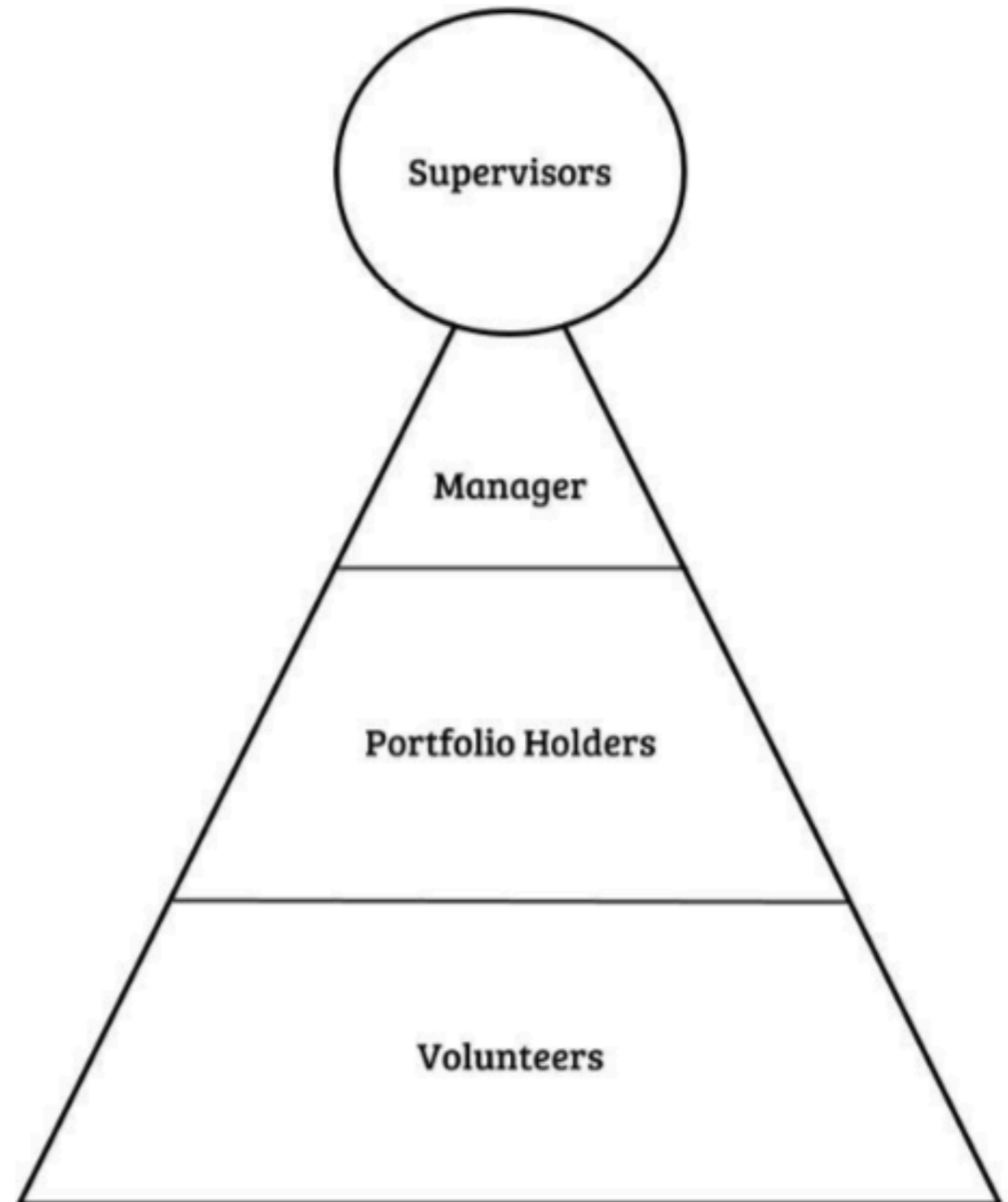


Figure 1: The organisational structure of the UvA Green Office

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The UvA Green Office is more or less based on the RootAbility Green Office model, with some adaptations to increase its functioning within the university and allotted budget. The UvA Green Office has four levels in its organisational structure, each performing its own crucial role in achieving our goals. These layers are visualised in the image to the right (figure 1).

# ROLES

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## Supervisors

The supervisors are the link between the UvA Green Office and the University of Amsterdam. The supervisors support the Green Office wherever needed and make sure the Green Office performs optimally and sufficiently within the university. The current supervisor is Ewout Doorman.

## Manager

The manager is responsible for all the actions of the members of the UvA Green Office and has to make sure everything goes according to plan. In order to achieve this, the manager determines the general strategy of the Green Office. In addition, the manager monitors the progress of the current projects and the work of the Portfolio Holders. The manager also decides on the expenses so that the allotted budget is use optimally. The current manager is Sat Kathpalia.



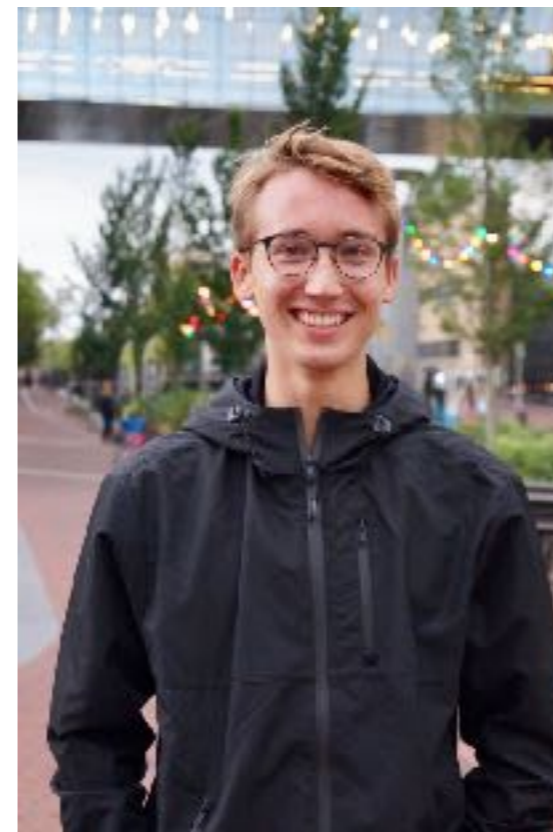


# ROLES

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## Portfolio Holders

Portfolio holders are an essential part of the Green Office as they are responsible for research and execution of projects. Each of the four portfolio holders are assigned to one of the four pillars. Their tasks consist of developing project plans, providing funding and contacts and managing the volunteers. In addition, they should motivate volunteers by organising social events and provide opportunities to develop their skills and knowledge, for example through workshops.



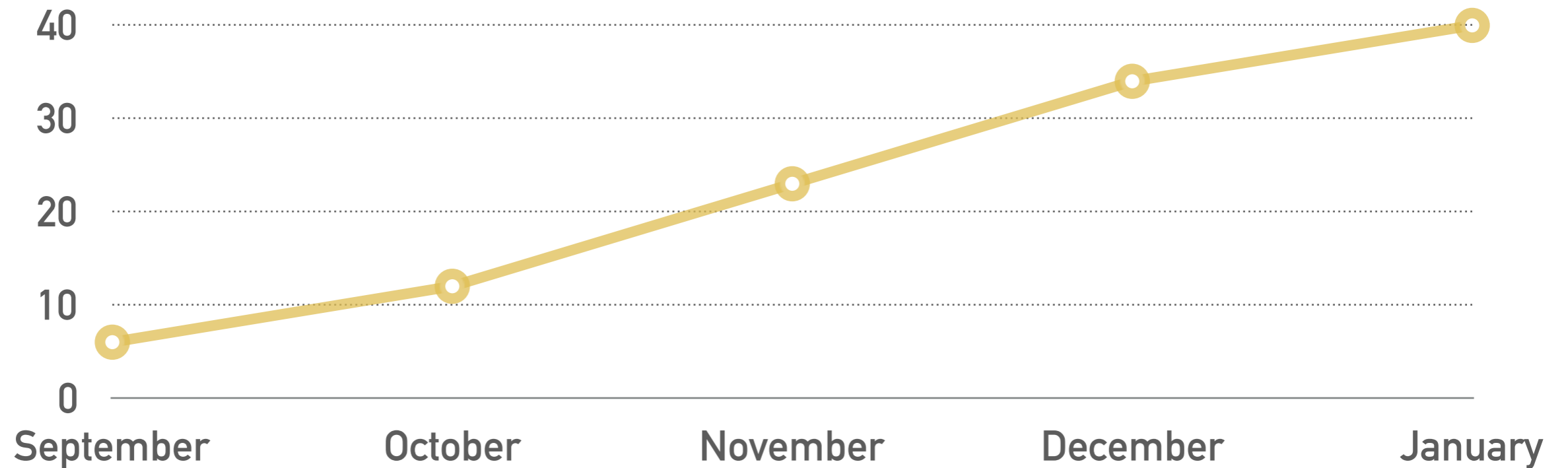
# ROLES

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## Volunteers

The Green Office has volunteers consisting of both students and staff. The volunteers work on the completion of projects or can create a project themselves to be proposed to the green office and supervisory board. The volunteers are connected with one or more projects and are assisted and overseen by the Portfolio Holders.

# PORTFOLIOS

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The Green Office works with different teams (Portfolios of volunteers, managed by Portfolio Holders). Each team has its own focus and addresses a different part of the sustainability issue within the university. A description of each Portfolio can be found below.



# PORTFOLIOS

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## **Campus**

The Portfolio Holder Campus is tasked with improving the sustainability of the buildings and facilities at the university. This includes topics such as waste separation, catering and energy. This work mainly occurs in cooperation with Facility Services and companies the UvA has a contract with (waste, catering etc.).

## **Community**

It is the task of Portfolio Holder Community to engage the students and staff members at the UvA to promote sustainable behaviour and spread knowledge concerning sustainability. This means organising challenges and events, but also working closely together with the other Portfolio Holders (Campus, Research & Education and Communications). The Community Portfolio Holder and his/her team must assist them with organising events and the promotion of ongoing and finished projects of both the Green Office and the university.

## **Research & Education**

The Portfolio Holder Research & Education is engaged with promoting sustainability in research and education at the university. This means both engaging students and researchers, but also providing a platform for current initiatives. His/her activities therefore include organising symposia and the GreenTalks.

## **Communications**

The Communications Portfolio Holder is responsible for communicating the achievements and activities of the UvA Green Office. This mainly done through social media, but also by making sure that the communication during events occurs properly and that all communication lives up to certain standards

# COMMUNITY PROJECTS

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## Reusable Cups

In October, a new team of volunteers continued with the idea of implementing a discount for students using their own, reusable coffee cup. First of all, the team continued with preparing research and a presentation about the topic to support them in convincing the university and catering company Cornet to support the idea. Other cafes like CREA already joined the initiative and will provide a 0,20€ discount in the future. For advertising the use of reusable coffee cups, the Green Office ordered a first batch of bamboo-fibre cups made of sustainable materials which can easily be washed. To create more awareness for the project, pictures were taken to serve as the basis for posters and social media campaigns. In the following weeks, the discount at cafeterias of the university will be finalised and its introduction will be supported by a documentary screening about the negative effects of disposables and plastic on the oceans.



# COMMUNITY PROJECTS

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## 10-day challenge

A team of students prepared a 10-day social media challenge with the goal to get people involved into more sustainable behaviour. On a daily basis, challenges will be held, encouraging different environmentally friendly practices which can be shared by the participants who will be able to win a small prize in the end.

# COMMUNITY PROJECTS

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## Intreeweek

Students collected ideas how the sustainability of Intreeweek could be improved. As many people will arrive in Amsterdam and at the university at the beginning of the next academic year, the introduction week will serve as the first contact for many new students. Thus, it should promote sustainable behaviour and incentivise people to reduce the waste produced during the week. In a meeting with members of the Intreeweek committee, these ideas were discussed and will be considered in their planning. However, it might be challenging to immediately achieve all goals due to costs and other restricting factors. Therefore, it is important that topics like sustainability will also stay relevant in the following years and room for improvement will be considered in cooperation between students, the Green Office and the Intreeweek committee.

# CAMPUS PROJECTS

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## **Taskforce Duurzaamheid**

The Taskforce Duurzaamheid is an association of staff members that are looking to spread and implement sustainable measures in their own departments. The Campus portfolio has been present in the monthly meetings to discuss ideas and help give the staff members a student perspective. In return, the staff members have provided the Green Office with contacts needed for other projects. Also, the Taskforce helped the Green Office to prepare for a meeting with the financial director to discuss the vacancy for a central point of reference for sustainability within the UvA.

Status: the Campus portfolio will keep attending the meetings and work with the Taskforce to professionalize their status



# CAMPUS PROJECTS

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## **Recycling/Marketplace household appliances for international students**

Together with the department on Housing (Student Services) and ICTS the campus portfolio is developing a system in which international students can trade/donate household appliances that otherwise would be bought new at the start of their stay. The Green Office is writing proposals in collaboration with ISN (International Student Network).

Status: the Campus portfolio is in contact with both ICTS and Housing to prepare proposals for the two biggest housing corporations: De Key and DUWO.



# CAMPUS PROJECTS

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## WWF Biodiversity

In collaboration with WWF and several other Green Offices (Tilburg, Eindhoven) and Student organisations (SvM, Storm) the UvA Green Office is working to shed light on the problem of biodiversity. The aim of this project is to organise events on this topic, coordinated with the other involved parties.

Status: In contact with the involved parties, brainstorming to think of events and projects that could contribute to the main goal.



# CAMPUS PROJECTS

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## Pen recycling

The Pen Recycling project is in collaboration with TerraCycle, a company that recycles writing utensils. The Green Office has several collection points at Roeterseiland Campus, Oudemanhuispoort and Science Park. When these collection points are filled up, they will be emptied and sent to TerraCycle, where they will be recycled.

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## Market ICTS

The Campus portfolio had a sustainability and circularity stand at the New Year's market of ICTS in collaboration with Kyra Somers (ICTS, Taskforce Duurzaamheid). We talked with various staff members to ask what we all can do to make the department more sustainable.

# CAMPUS PROJECTS

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## **Klimaatdialoog Jonge Klimaatagenda**

The Campus portfolio represented the UvA Green Office at the Climate Dialogue for youth organisations of the Netherlands, to help ‘De Jonge Klimaatbeweging’ write their new proposal for ‘de Jonge Klimaatagenda’. This proposal will be presented to the national government.

Status: the Campus portfolio will participate in the next Climate Dialogue at the end of March 2019’



# CAMPUS PROJECTS

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## Cleaning products

The campus portfolio has strived to do research on sustainable cleaning products that were used at Oudemanshuispoort. We have been in contact with the manager of the cleaning staff of that location, as well as the facility manager.

Status: on hold, no prospect on when it will be resumed. The satisfaction rates were too low, so the facility manager decided to switch back to regular products. However, this project should be picked up after a new contract has been signed (before the end of the academic year).



# CAMPUS PROJECTS

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## Waste separation

The GO is monitoring the progress of waste separation at the different locations. Waste separation is essential in order to increase the amount of recycled materials. The waste company contracted by the UvA tries to separate waste after collecting it, but this technique is not as effective as separating the waste streams at the source. The transition from not separating waste to separating several streams can be rough and difficult, which makes a proper campaign essential. Therefore the Campus portfolio has been involved to create a new vision on waste separation, working with the “Ladder of Lansink” procedure. Also, we have been contacting other Green Offices and sustainable initiatives to learn about their approaches, which are shown to the creators of the waste policy.

Status: currently on hold, as the project leader has resigned. When a new leader is appointed, this project will be resumed.

# COMMUNICATION PROJECTS

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## Human Resource Management and Recruitment

Due to the increased demand, a more structured and formal approach towards recruitment was needed. Now, applicants are required to fill in an online form on the website and attend an one-on-one interview. The recruitment form is based on general information about the applicant as well as a requirement to answer specific question about the sustainability and the attachment of a curriculum vitae. This application process lengthened the durability of our volunteers, due to the increased entry barriers.

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## Green Office Newsletter

As a form of internal and external update procedure, we implemented the biweekly newsletter. The newsletter includes upcoming events of the Green Office, recent publications on the blog and also summaries of internal events.

The newsletters is being sent out to 81 recipients, with a growth rate of 2% per week.

## UvA Green Office Newsletter Nr.3

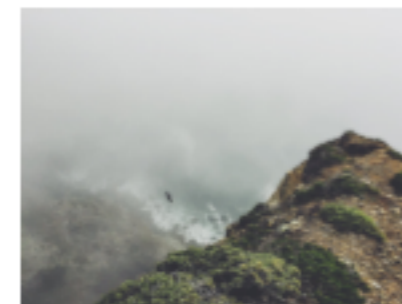

The two-day conference with esteemed speakers such as author of “Doughnut Economics” Kate Raworth and CEO of Phillips Frans von Houten was split into the "Exploration Track" and the "Challenge Track", the latter of which the Green Office was honoured to attend. In the "Challenge Track" which involved interactive workshops and required a special application, we shared our lessons learned in trying to reduce plastic use and improve waste separation at the UvA. In that way, we connected to many stakeholders in and beyond Amsterdam, a network the Green Office will surely benefit from in the future.
